

This month I will start a short series on "The Prodigal Ford" or "Lizzy, Come Home"

by Roger Barrett.

During 1953 I was a senior at Canoga Park High School in Southern California. My transportation was a 1928 Model A pickup. My friends all drove similar vintage vehicles and we were constantly on the lookout for more. The concept of restoring cars had not reached us. We simply repaired and drove them. There was a glut of old cars in those days and no one wanted them. I bought a very nice 1937 Plymouth sedan that ran for \$7.00 and a shabby looking 1934 Auburn Roadster that did not run for \$10.00. Our rule of thumb was to pay no more than the value of the tires and battery. The 1927 Buick roadster, which I still have, was rather expensive, it cost \$25.00.

One of our group said that he knew of a Model T at a pig farm in Calabasas and invited us to go and look at it which we did. Calabasas today is the home of Justin Bieber and other celebrities. Back then, it was quite different. The car, of course, was in a barn. The T was a 1926 roadster pickup. It was a 1930's hotrod with a Rajo overhead valve setup, Bosch ignition and a Winfield carburetor. The firewall had been cut away in the center and the gas tank modified to allow for the overhead valve casting. The windshield and the top had been lowered several inches. The license plate was 1940. The woman who owned the pig farm was happy to have us admire the car but, she said that it belonged to her son and was not for sale.

By 1954, I was working for the Knickerbocker Plastic Company in North Hollywood making squirt guns. The work shift ended at 4 AM. And my commuter was a 1924 TT truck with a large wooden cab. My friends called the truck *Teddy* because it was a *Rough Rider*. One morning, I was standing in the predawn parking lot facing east getting ready to crank start the truck. Suddenly, there was a brilliant flash that lit up the whole horizon. They were testing an atomic bomb in Nevada. The image of that truck cab against a bright background is still vivid in my memory.

By 1956, I was working for Pacific Telephone and living in Glendale. I had acquired a nicely restored1930 Model A coupe. At this time, Ed Winfield had a shop in Glendale so, when the Model A needed engine work, I took him the camshaft and he personally reground it for me. During the fall of 1957, I was drafted into the army.
