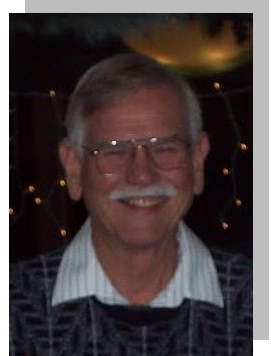

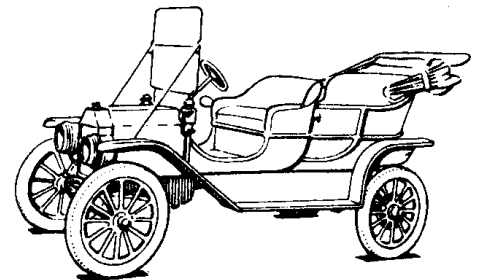

Seven (or so) New Year Resolutions for Mother Lode Model T Ford Club Members

Many of us take this time to reflect on the past and make a few commitments or at least a few wishes for the coming year. Beyond that reoccurring goal of losing a few pounds, getting in a bit more exercise, or perhaps putting a little more savings in the piggy bank for a rainy day, let's not forget that old car hobby of ours and what joy it brings ... at least most of the time! And time is what it's all about my friends and how to make a great pastime even better. Here are some resolution suggestions that you might want to consider making you're your own ... or perhaps your spouse's, kid's or even your parent's... with their approval, of course.



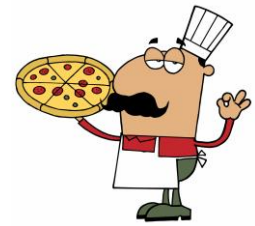
1. **Keep the garage or workshop better organized this year** – Come on now, face it. Most of us could benefit by being able to access the right tool at the right time at the right place. There are many suggestions that are helpful, like applying the “80/20 rule” – You probably use only 20% of your tools 80% of the time. Keep those 20% tools extra clean, organized and ready to go and the rest (the 80%) somewhere out of the way, but remember where you put them just in case you need them!
2. **Get the car ready for tour before the tour** – Nothing like thinking that *Old Henry* is ready for the ride only to discover that the battery is dead, bands are slipping, and the needle valve in the carburetor is a stuck victim of our lovely modern ethanol gasolines. It's always a good idea to do a thorough inspection and test run at least a week in advance of a tour. That should give you a reasonable amount of time to track down any necessary parts and get *Henry* feeling up to the task at hand.

3. **Carry really useful tools in the car** – It’s amazing to see what we actually take with the car and what we somehow seem to forget when out on tour. As mentioned, just as in the garage/workshop, certain tools are really important and others are just nice-to-have. Do you have that band adjustment tool close at hand? Make sure to review the detailed list of suggested tools and supplies listed on the club’s web site under our Safe Touring Guide. A few years ago while on tour, we were all surprised when one of the cars desperately needed air and no one was carrying a tire pump and few gas stations were able to help out. P.S. Did Santa bring John a tire pump for Christmas? (LOL)
4. **Drive that Model T more this year** – Since you are a member of this club, you already know what a great activity driving that T (A, or other old car) and touring with family and friends can be. In a recent article from Hemmings Classic Car magazine titled “Senseless Stashing” Richard Lentinello makes a great case for driving those old cars more often, not only because it is better for the car, but it’s better for you too! He questions those who treat their cars as irreplaceable ultra-rare artifacts that are never driven by saying “The next owner may very well drive the treads off your car’s tires the first day he gets behind the wheel, so why save that experience for him to enjoy when you can enjoy it instead?” Good point – Life is way too short!

January 6th through May 15th – Docent Training for new tour guides to the museum.

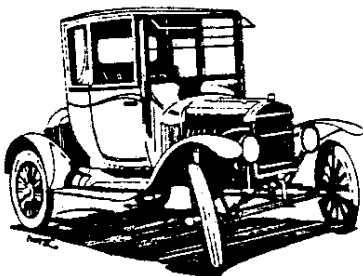

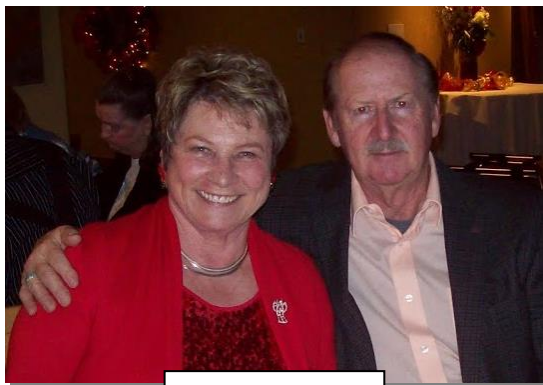

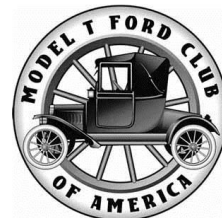
