Meeting Minutes - No meetings during December

California Auto Museum - New Home Update (Reprinted from the January-February CAM Fuel newsletter)

We are happy to report that we have made great progress on our quest for a new building. The site that we are working on is where we are now - 2200 Front Street. The City of Sacramento has been working hard to help us make this happen. Years of this Board and previous Boards trying to make our site more permanent, a change in City staff, not to mention the economy, has led to a change of heart. We have been very lucky to find a partner in this project, Paul Snider, with his dream of opening a Natural History Museum in Sacramento. Thankfully, Mr. Snider has adopted us and will provide much of the funding for the building that both museums will occupy. At first, the combination of an Auto Museum and a Natural History museum may seem a bit odd, but after working together literally for years, it really seems like a good fit now. Subject to change, the current proposal has a 90,000 square foot footprint in roughly the same location as the existing 72,000 square foot building, which will be removed. The building will also have a 70,000 square foot second floor, leaving a total square footage of 160,000. The Natural History Museum expects to use 50,000 square feet of this and common areas like offices, event rooms, gift shops, café, elevators and rest rooms will take 25-35,000 square feet, leaving the automobile museum with at least as much space as our entire building today, just for display.

The current design calls for a translucent, polycarbonate, curved wall across most of the front of the building, on the North side. When you step inside, you will enter a large, 3½ story tall atrium entrance providing drama similar to the new Crocker Art Museum. That will be a multi-purpose area to hold large events in, provide the visitors a taste of what they will see in the two museum display areas and provide sit-down seating for the café.

The Natural History Museum will feature a 35' tall mountain, a dramatic place to display some of the museum's collection. We expect that both museums will utilize both floors and we will have a freight elevator to bring artifacts to the second floor.

We will not get a free ride on the financing of this project. Although Mr. Snider has agreed to cover the majority of the cost of the new building – if these preliminary plans are finalized - we have committed to raise millions of dollars to help with that effort and to build the internal improvements for our part of the building, not to mention our intention to build dioramas in an effort to make our museum among the very best in the world. Thanks for all your support!

Free Movie Shows

I can't remember when the practice started or ended or how wide spread it became but I am guessing about 1920 - 1930. Free moving picture shows were put on once a week in the summer in very small towns by the combined donations of the local merchants to drum up some extra business.

The Colonel once had a Nickelodeon Theater or more likely, acquired the remains after its demise and still had the projector. Anyway, he put on the shows in our town. A screen was set up out in the street and people gathered all around. Cars were parked in the back in a semi-circle and people provided their own seating (chairs, boxes, blankets, etc.) In front. It always seemed like forever to wait till it got dark enough to start the show.

The projector never worked very well and there was a lot of vibration, clicking and flicking. The film often slipped on the drive sprockets and showed the bottom half of one picture and top half of the next picture on the screen. Or worse - stick momentarily until the heat from the projection lamp burned the celluloid film in two. Usually a short strip of (important) film was lost to rewinding and a "long"wait ensued. It always seemed to happen at the most critical part of the film. The projector was noisy but its distinctive noises were music to our ears.

The films were silent and in black and white. The dialog was interspersed with the pictures for you to read. If you couldn't read fast enough your imagination filled in. Tom Mix on his wonderful horse Tony, and Hoot Gibson routed a lot of unfortunate Indians. Usually a program began with a series of colored glass slides which were the first commercials and about as welcome. Then a one real comedy was shown. Felix the cat and Our Gang comedies were popular!

Rain was a problem but, unless it was pretty strong, the show went on. I don't remember how they covered the projector - probably a tent of sorts. Once in an unexpected rain, we fled to Dad's car which happened to be parked behind the screen. To our delighted surprise we could see the picture pretty good through the wet screen and watched the rest out of the rain.

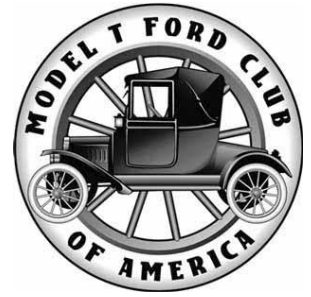
